1. **Deuteronomy 14:22 (NLT)**
²² "You must set aside a tithe of your crops—one-tenth of all the crops you harvest each year.
2. **Deuteronomy 14:23 (NLT)**
²³ Bring this tithe to the place the LORD your God chooses for his name to be honored, and eat it there in his presence. This applies to your tithes of grain, new wine, olive oil, and the firstborn males of your flocks and herds. The purpose of tithing is to teach you always to fear the LORD your God.

15. **Proverbs 11:28 (NLT)**
²⁸ Trust in your money and down you go! But the godly flourish like leaves in spring.
16. **Proverbs 12:11 (NLT)**
¹¹ Hard work means prosperity; only fools idle away their time.
17. **Proverbs 13:7 (NLT)**
⁷ Some who are poor pretend to be rich; others who are rich pretend to be poor.
18. **Proverbs 13:11 (NLT)**
¹¹ Wealth from get-rich-quick schemes quickly disappears; wealth from hard work grows.

²⁷ Dishonest money brings grief to the whole family, but those who hate bribes will live.

⁶ It is better to be poor and honest than rich and crooked.
45. **Proverbs 28:11 (NLT)**
¹¹ Rich people picture themselves as wise, but their real poverty is evident to the poor.

¹⁹ Hard workers have plenty of food; playing around brings poverty.

54. **Proverbs 31:16 (NLT)**
¹⁶ She goes out to inspect a field and buys it; with her earnings she plants a vineyard.
55. **Ecclesiastes 5:10 (NLT)**
¹⁰ Those who love money will never have enough. How absurd to think that wealth brings true happiness!
56. **Ecclesiastes 5:15 (NLT)**
¹⁵ People who live only for wealth come to the end of their lives as naked and empty-handed as on the day they were born.

61. **Luke 6:34 (NLT)**
³⁴ And if you lend money only to those who can repay you, what good is that? Even sinners will lend to their own kind for a full return.
62. **Luke 12:21 (NLT)**
²¹ "Yes, a person is a fool to store up earthly wealth but not have a rich relationship with God."
63. **Luke 14:28 (NLT)**
²⁸ "But don't begin until you count the cost. For who would begin construction of a building without first getting estimates and then checking to see if there is enough money to pay the bills?"
64. **Luke 14:30 (NLT)**
³⁰ They would say, 'There's the person who started that building and ran out of money before it was finished!'

¹³ "A few days later this younger son packed all his belongings and took a trip to a distant land, and there he wasted all his money on wild living.

²⁴ Then turning to the others standing nearby, the king ordered, 'Take the money from this servant, and give it to the one who earned the most.'

79. **2 Timothy 3:2 (NLT)**
² For people will love only themselves and their money. They will be boastful and proud, scoffing at God, disobedient to their parents, and ungrateful. They will consider nothing sacred.
